

June 1, 2015  
Regular Session

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Glenn Wright. Members present were Mr. Miller, Mrs. Wynn, and Mr. Moore, Mr. Lewis, and Mr. McWhorter.

Mayor Wright opened the meeting with prayer.

Mr. Moore made a motion to approve the May 18, 2015 regular session minutes as presented with corrections, after a second by Mr. Miller the motion passed 4-0-1 with Mr. McWhorter abstaining.

Mr. Lewis made a motion to approve the May 18, 2015 executive session minutes as presented, after a second by Mr. Miller the motion passed 4-0-1 with Mr. McWhorter abstaining.

Cail Hammons and Kendrick Ward presented a mid-year report for the Greensboro Main Street Program. Greensboro was awarded the CHIP grant in 2014 and implementation of the grant has been delayed by changes to the program's rules and procedures by DCA. Plans are being finalized for the Gateway Enhancement Project slated for Highways 278 and 15 intersection. The Arbor Day ceremony was held inside City Hall due to the weather and a new tree was planted in front of City Hall. The downtown has gained two new businesses, expanded one business, and lost one business.

Mr. McWhorter made a motion to approve the request by Kendrick Ward to close downtown streets as presented for the following events: Back to School Bash to be held August 1<sup>st</sup>, Cruise-In to be held September 19<sup>th</sup>, and A Tasteful Event to be held September 21<sup>st</sup> which will require staggered closing times, after a second by Mr. Miller the motion passed 4-0.

Cail Hammons discussed the Greensboro Housing survey, which is a project part of the Greensboro Community Housing team. The survey will be used to plan for better neighborhoods and improved housing in Greensboro. The survey will be mailed with the July water bill. Cail was authorized to move forward with mailing out the Housing Surveys.

The first reading of the ordinance to establish the corridor overlay district was done.

The first reading of the ordinance to establish regulations for adult day care, adult day centers, and adult day health centers was done.

Mr. Miller made a motion to approve the Alley Use Study, which provide recommendations for improvement of the public alleys in downtown, after a second by Mr. Moore the motion passed 5-0.

Mrs. Wynn made a motion to delete section 28-4 Prohibition of employee and business owner vehicle parking in certain areas of the historic downtown area from the Greensboro Code, after a second by Mr. McWhorter the motion passed 5-0.

Mr. Miller made a motion to adjourn the meeting after a second by Mr. McWhorter the motion passed 5-0.

There being no further business Mr. Moore closed the meeting with prayer.
